



#### THE BEAUTIFUL MISS CROKER.

AN INTERVIEW WITH THE ONLY SURVIVING SITTER TO SIR THOMAS LAWRENCE.

(By Arthur Lawrence, in July "The World and His Wife.") LEAVES FROM AN OLD DIARY

The "Croker Papers," for the writing of which the father of Mr John Murray, the publisher, paid a thousand pounds, so that such an interesting footnote to history. thousand pounds, so that such an interesting footnote to history should not be lost, contain one or two allusions to 'Nony.' Under date June 13th, 1821i we read in the 'Croker Papers': 'Took my little girl (Nony) to the King's (George IV.) ball. We arrived five minutes after the time appointed, half-past eight. His Majesty already in the room. He was very gracious to Nony, and kissed her at her departure. Princess Augusta also took great notice.' It was on April 28th, 1828, at the age of eighteen, that Miss Croker was presented at Court. Mr Croker writes in his diary: 'The King's Drawing-Room. Mrs Peel was to have presented Nony, but she is ill, and Lady Ann Beckett presented her. The King recognised her and spoke affectionately to her, and told me, as I passed by afterwards, that he had a great cariosity to see his 'little friend' after so long an interval.'

The picture by Sir Thomas Lawrence was shown in the Academy exhibition of 1827; and Mr Croker stated that no portrait of the same size and class ever produced so great an impression. It was said of this picture of 'sweet seventeen,' by Allan Cunningham, that 'mem stood before it in a half-circle, admiring its loveliness.'

'What was your impression of

that "men stood before it in a half-circle, admiring its loveliness."

"What w.s your impression of Sir Thomas Lawrence?" I ask.

"That he was good and kind." is the reply. "I was so astonished that he could smoke, and talk, and paint my picture; that he could do so many things at one time. He talked to me all the while about what was happening at that day. I admired and liked him very much."

It was the only picture over paint-

It was the only picture ever painted of the lovely Miss Croker, who did not sit again, either to Lawrence or to anyone else.

THE FATE OF THE FAMOUS PICTURE.
